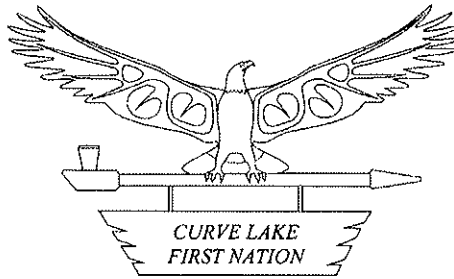

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

As outlined in the Curve Lake First Nation Employment Policy, applications from Curve Lake First Nation Members are currently being accepted for the following **Training** Position.

POSITION: LANDS OFFICER – Training Position

DUTIES:

Under the general supervision of the General Manager and the functional supervision of the Senior Lands Officer, the Lands Officer in Training will be required to register in Reserve Land and Environmental Management Program Training offered by Indian and Northern Affairs Canada. Level One of this training requires attendance at the University of Saskatchewan for four, two week academic sessions. Each academic session is followed by 10 weeks of distance education to be completed as on-the-job training. Upon successful completion of Level One the successful candidate will have obtained a ***Certificate of Proficiency in Indigenous People Resource Management***. A second year of study (Level Two) is delivered by the National Aboriginal Lands Managers Association and involves six one week training sessions with additional home study. Successfully completing levels one and two will provide the Lands Officer with their Professional Lands Management Certification.

Through this training, and under the functional supervision of the Senior Lands Officer, the successful candidate will acquire the skills necessary to complete the following duties as a Lands Officer:

Co-manage with the Department of Indian Affairs all matters concerning the administration of Reserve and Designated Lands in the Curve Lake First Nation.

Negotiate the terms of application to use and occupy Curve Lake First Nation lands under a lease or permit contract.

Implement procedures to obtain, under lease and permit, the use and occupation of Band and Locatee Lands.

Monitor and ensure compliance of terms and conditions under lease and permit.

Prepare and process all transactions relating to Individual Land Holdings or Locatees interest.

Maintain a record keeping system of all transactions related to Band Land, Individual Land Holdings and Estate interest in Reserve and Designated Lands for the Curve Lake First Nation.

To assist in the compliance with Environmental Assessment procedures.

Responsible for assisting in the development and implementation of land use planning policies for the Curve Lake First Nation.

Perform other related duties as required.

TERM OF EMPLOYMENT: This is a training position. The first two week session at the University of Saskatchewan is scheduled to begin April 28th, 2008. Ability to attend that session will be a condition of the offer of employment. Upon successful completion of the Level One Certificate and commitment to complete Level Two and obtain the Professional Lands Manager Certification in year two, the position will become permanent full time.

RATE OF PAY: \$28,000.00 per year.

QUALIFICATIONS: Willingness to successfully complete training and obtain Professional Lands Management Certificate within two years.
